## Rural Management Programme students undergo Block Placements

Block-level Placement is an integral part of the Rural Management programme curriculum. Its objective is to provide students with firsthand experience of the implementation and impact of various government programmes and schemes for sustainable community development at the block level. For the first-year students of the 2024-26 batch, Block Placement was conducted from 6-15 January 2025.

Students were divided into seven groups and assigned to different blocks in the Ranchi district - Kanke, Ratu, Ormanjhi, Nagri, Itki, Angara, and Namkum. Each group, comprising both male and female students, visited their respective blocks daily.

During the placement, students observed and analyzed key government initiatives such as MGNREGA, PMAY, SRLM, DDU-GKY, and NSAP, which focus on

After completing their study, students submitted a report detailing their observations and insights to the Block Development Officer. The Block Placement was conducted under the supervision of Dr Pawas Suren and Dr Sanjay K. Verma.

# Talk on Gandhi Peace fellowship

The Rural Management Programme of XISS hosted a talk on the Gandhi Fellowship on 9 January 2025. The Gandhi Fellowship by the Piramal Foundation is a two-year residential program that develops young leaders for social impact. Fellows work on grassroots projects in education, health, and governance, gaining hands-on experience in systemic change. The program offers leadership training, mentorship, and a stipend, equipping graduates and postgraduates for careers in development, policymaking, and entrepreneurship. Esteemed speakers from the Piramal Foundation, including Ms Ekta Singh, Senior Program Manager, Ms Abhilasha Roy, Program Manager, and Ms Purnima Singh, Program Manager shared insights on the fellowship's application process, the 23-month experience, and the skills gained from community work. They also discussed collaboration with government officials and youth engagement across India.

## Rural Camp organized by Rural Management Programme

Rural Management Programme of XISS, Ranchi organized six Rural Camps from 11-20 February 2025 in six villages of Ranchi District. The second rural camp for the first-year students of the Rural Management Programme (Batch 2024-26) was conducted to offer students first-hand exposure to rural life and community dynamics while equipping them with practical skills in Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) tools. Spread across three different villages in Ranchi district, the students were divided into groups, each stationed at a designated village under the guidance of a faculty in-charge.

Group A was placed in Sakarpada village, located in Jhinjhri Panchayat of Mandar Block. Their campsite was at the Sakarpada Government High School, and the group was supervised by Dr Anant Kumar. Group B carried out their fieldwork in Hesatu village under Hesatu Panchayat in Angara Block, with Dr Niranjan Sahoo as their faculty mentor. The third group, Group C, was based in Chinaro Puriyo village of Itki Block, with Dr Pramil Kumar Panda providing guidance and support.

Throughout the ten-day camp, students engaged actively with the local communities, immersing themselves in the everyday lives of the villagers to learn and practice a variety of PRA tools, which allowed them to gather information directly from the people through participatory techniques. The camp was not only a learning exercise in rural appraisal methods but also a deeply immersive experience, allowing students to reflect on the complexities of rural life and the critical role of participatory approaches in development planning.

The third rural camp for the second-year students of the Rural Management Programme (Batch 2023-25) was held during the sixth trimester at three different villages across Ranchi and Gumla districts. This camp, conducted under the supervision of faculty mentors, was designed to enable students to develop a micro plan for each village using Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) tools. The camp served as a practical platform for students to apply their classroom learning to real-life rural settings while working closely with local communities. The students were divided into three groups, each stationed in a separate village.

Group A was placed in Tengariya village of Dighiya Panchayat in Bero Block, Ranchi. Their camp activities were based at the Rajkriyakrit Prathamik Vidyalaya under the guidance of Dr Raj Shree Verma and Dr K Kusumavathi. Group B was assigned to Kewall village in Sidroll Panchayat, Namkum Block, Ranchi, with their campsite at the XIPT Campus, and Dr Pawas Suren and Dr Sanjay Verma served as their faculty mentors. Group C carried out its activities in Lakeya village in Sisai Block, Gumla, under the supervision of Dr Sourya Das.

The primary objective of the camp was to prepare a participatory micro plan for each village, which would serve as a comprehensive development roadmap based on community inputs. Throughout the camp, students interacted extensively with villagers to understand their lived realities, needs, and aspirations, ensuring that the planning process was inclusive and participatory.

The camp was a valuable experiential learning opportunity for the students, who gained practical exposure to participatory planning processes and learned how to facilitate meaningful community engagement. This process not only reinforced their learning but also encouraged critical thinking and peer feedback, strengthening their ability to design practical, community-centered development interventions.

## Guest Talk on Children in the Street Situation

A special talk on Children on Street Situations was delivered by Ms Preeti Mathew from Rainbow Foundation, Hyderabad, and Ms Shubhada from Rainbow Homes, Pune to the class of Rural Management first year students on 26 Feb 2025. The session highlighted the harsh realities faced by India's 11 million street children, who remain undocumented and vulnerable.

Ms Mathew discussed the root causes of child homelessness, including poverty, displacement, and landlessness, while distinguishing between "Children on the Street" and "Children of the Street." Ms Shubhada elaborated on legal frameworks such as the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and the Juvenile Justice Act, explaining how Rainbow Foundation provides shelter, education, and empowerment through a rights-based, family-centered approach.

The session included success stories like that of Lilly, who overcame childhood adversity to become a chef in Delhi and other girls who secured jobs in seven-star hotels in Dubai. The discussion emphasized the need for policy interventions and social support systems to protect street children. The session concluded with an engaging Q&A and a vote of thanks. Dr Niranjan Sahoo and Dr Sourya Das coordinated the Guest Lecture.
