A State-level round-table discussion on 'World Day Against Trafficking in Person' was conducted by Save the Children (STC) in collaboration with the Rural Management Programme of XISS, Ranchi, and its media partner Morning India on 28 July 2022. This year's theme for the day was "Use and Abuse of Technology," and a number of distinguished speakers were invited to give their opinion to raise awareness about promoting and defending the rights of victims of human trafficking. Dr Pradeep Kerketta SJ, Assistant Director, XISS, Ranchi, opened the event and discussed the fundamental elements of human trafficking, as well as the role that technology plays in enabling traffickers to expand into remote and interior areas through improved communication and transportation systems. Discussing child trafficking with an emphasis on Jharkhand, Mr Mahadev Hansda from STC pleaded that human trafficking is a massive violation of human rights and should not be

tolerated. Ms Asunta Lakra, National Hockey player and former National Captain, spoke about the various social variables that encourage human trafficking and the need for knowledge in order to combat it. She mentioned that every home has to have a safe family atmosphere, and every girl needs to be safeguarded and given the opportunity to pursue her dreams. The programme followed with a panel discussion, which was chaired by Dr Anant Kumar, Head of Programme (HoP), Rural Management. The panellists were Dr Rajshree Verma, Assistant Professor, RM, XISS, along with Ms Nidhi Dwivedi, IPS, SP, CID; Ms Priti Srivastava, Child Protection Specialist, UNICEF, Jharkhand; Mr Madhukar, Senior Journalist, DD Bharti, and Mr Praveen Raman, Deputy Editor, Morning India. 'COVID vaccination Amrit Mahotsava' began from 15 July 2022 to provide free precautionary dose to all adult eligible population. It is a part of the celebration for 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav'. Likewise in Jharkhand, the campaign began in full swing. It saw a spike in the number of people taking precaution doses. The XISS-UNICEF supported district coordinators in 14 districts of the state are facilitating the preparation of strategic and focused micro plans and session sites. They are actively involved in the day-to-day monitoring of the vaccination data, presenting the analysis in district-level task force meetings led by District Collectors (DCs). They are also coordinating with Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in awareness generation in the hard-to-reach pockets and tribal belts.
